



Emergency Response

The Alaska Energy Authority provides on-call emergency response to a community to reduce imminent threat to life or property during extended power outages.

AEA responds to a real or potential emergency situation before disaster or major loss occurs. Emergency response can include the repair of existing infrastructure or the procurement and/or installation of new equipment including engines, generators, and transformers.

Funding is by Alaska legislative appropriation for procurement of manpower, materials, and equipment during the emergency.

Current Status Third Quarter 2016:

For the third quarter of calendar year 2016 three requests were received for emergency response from Arctic Village, Diomedes and Hughes. For each response AEA staff worked closely with the Alaska Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management Office. Arctic Village had a faulty connection to a transformer. Hughes had an issue with their generation switchgear. Diomedes had a faulty feeder breaker. Only Arctic Village required a trip to the community. Both Hughes and Diomedes responses were resolved via telephonic support saving the State significant travel costs.
